We are looking forward to a fun and exciting week at the Meridian District Day Camp and have already been hard at work preparing an exciting mission. Our theme this year is “All-American Sports.”

Campers - Please make sure you have turned in your Medical form and copies of both sides of your insurance card to your pack’s Day Camp Coordinator (or Cubmaster). The medical form is available at www.MeridianDayCamp.org.

You will be receiving a camp t-shirt on the first day of camp. Please wear this every day of camp. The T-shirt will help to identify you.

You will also need to bring:

1. a snack (avoid peanuts)
2. a bag lunch (avoid peanuts)
3. a swim suit, towel, and sunscreen
4. A hat
5. and a water bottle. [An 8-16 oz bottle is an ideal size. We will provide lots of water for refills throughout the day]
6. Wear cool clothing; shorts and tennis shoes recommended; no uniforms needed other than the camp t-shirt

Parent Volunteers - Thank you for your time. As Unit leaders and Staff Assistants we appreciate all you do. *You need to be registered with BSA as a leader.* Applications are available at <http://meridiandaycamp.org/forms.html>. Please plan to be at camp in time for an 8:45am staff meeting every morning. **Please bring a cooler, with ice, to store lunches for about 12 boys.** You will also be given a camp t-shirt to be worn every day at camp and a name tag. If you are not at camp for 5 days the t-shirt will need to be turned in at the end of the day to be washed and shared with others. Please check in at the staff area located to the right of the main path every morning and check out there every afternoon when leaving. We appreciate your cooperation.

Youth Staff - Thank you for your time. We appreciate your help. Please bring a bag lunch each day. You will also be given a camp t-shirt to be worn every day at camp. Please check -in at “Headquarters” each morning in time for an 8:45 staff meeting.. You will also need to check out upon leaving every day.

Tags - Tags are **pre-registered** younger children whose parents are volunteering at camp. Please note that our Tag staff will be at their post by 8:30am each morning. Please do NOT drop off your Tag before that time unless the Tag staff is present and ready to start their day. Please do NOT let your Tag roam around camp alone. Each Tag will be provided with a t-shirt to be worn every day at camp. Each child will need to have a snack and a lunch. Some extra snacks will be provided throughout the day for this age group only (Goldfish crackers, cheerios, etc...)

Cub Scout Day Camp Rules

- Show respect to others
- No bad or rude language
- Keep your hands to yourself. No fighting, pushing or hitting
- The Scout Oath and Law are the basis of all conduct in Camp. Every camper is expected to abide by the customs, policies and ideals of the Mt. Diablo Silverado council
- Use the buddy system
- Cub scouts must stay with your den at all times
- Check in and out with den leaders when leaving the area with your buddy.
- Wear shoes at all times, except when swimming - no sandals.
- No knives
- No smoking
- All medication must be given to the Camp Nurse for dispersal.
- All campers must be checked out and picked up by a parent or authorized pick up person
- All late arrivals must check-in at headquarters
- **Have fun.**

Anyone not obeying the rules will be:

First time: Handled by Camp Staff

Second time: Reported to Camp Directors

Third time: Sent Home for the day

Fourth time: Asked not to return.

Parents - Please be advised that girls under the age of 14 are not covered by the cub scout insurance. Girls over the age of 14 must join Ventures and will be covered by their insurance.

Do not pack a lunch on Friday, June 24 – the last day of camp. We will have a special "All-American" lunch served. This lunch is free and provided for all volunteers working that day, camp staff, and campers.
